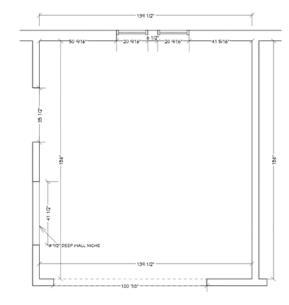
PROJECT OVERVIEW

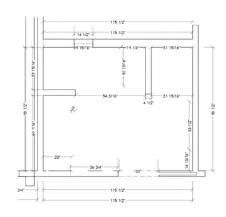

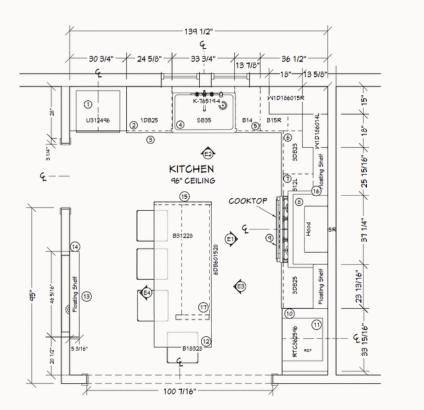

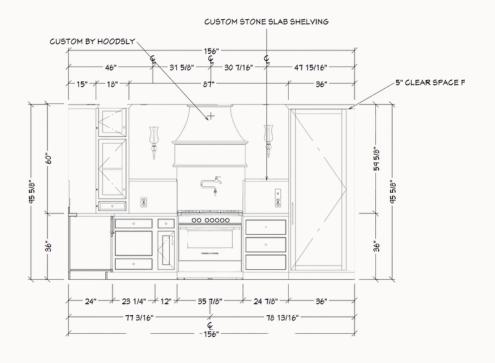




ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION PLAN

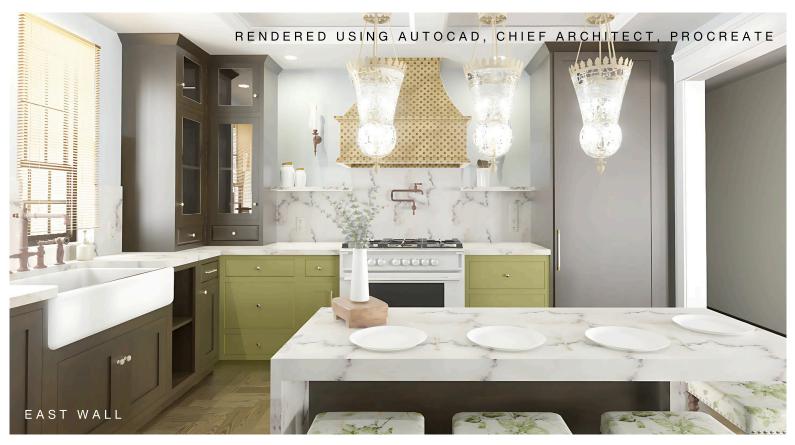

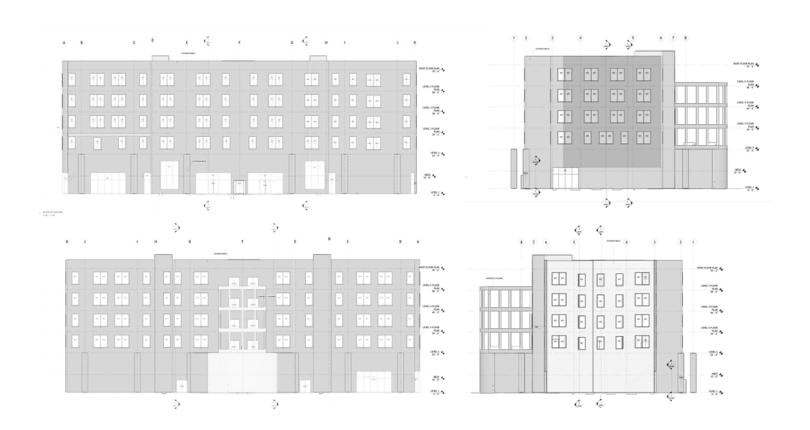

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Hotel Laya is a hospitality project that weaves together cultural heritage, sustainability, and biophilic design. The first floor organizes into four primary spaces: an entry lobby, a spa, a cultural exhibition, and a café-style restaurant, all designed in compliance with codes for egress, fire safety, and occupancy.

The name "Laya," which translates to harmony, reflects the hotel's goal of using heritage-inspired colors to create balance throughout the interiors. Each space draws from a distinct hue rooted in Indian cultural tradition, reinforcing the hotel's narrative of harmony through design.

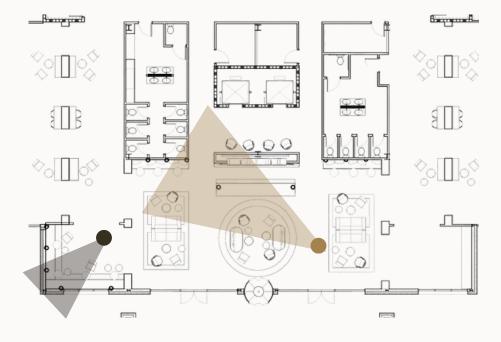

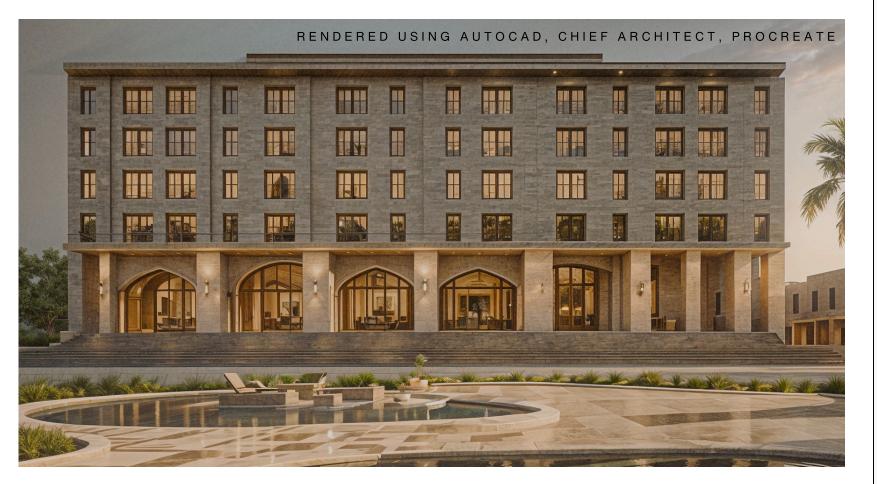


SPACIAL ANALYSIS

The spatial planning of the central hotel lobby is anchored by two elevators and defined by a striking vaulted ceiling that draws the eye toward a mosaic tile feature wall with a waterfall and the hotel's logo. Arches are strategically employed as wayfinding elements, guiding guests through the space with elegance and clarity. Varying ceiling heights further enhance the experience, creating a balance between openness and intimacy while fostering a cozy yet sophisticated atmosphere.

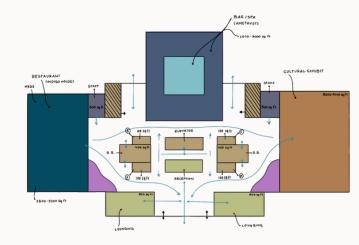


ENLARGED LOBBY PLAN (N.T.S)

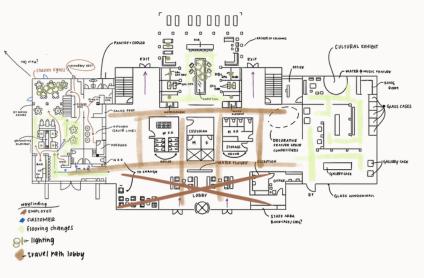








IN-CONTEXT BUBBLE DIAGRAM

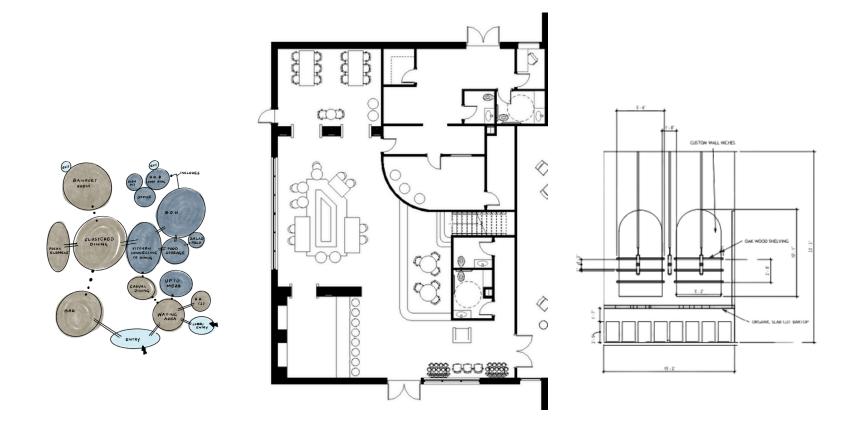

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Primrose Beach House is designed for Cindy Crawford and her husband, sitting on an open waterfront lot in Bay County, Florida. The project creates a contemporary beach house that seamlessly integrates modern aesthetics, sustainability, and innovative technology, while respecting the surrounding natural beauty of the waterfront environment. The house features approximately 2,500 square feet of living space with 3 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, and an open floor plan that fosters a connection with the outdoors. A screened-in porch provides a protected area for outdoor living.

The design draws from a historic architectural style while incorporating innovative technology and sustainable materials. Compliance with Bay County codes, Callaway City codes, and FEMA flood guidelines is prioritized to ensure the house meets all safety and zoning requirements.

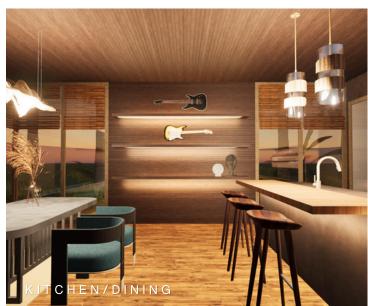

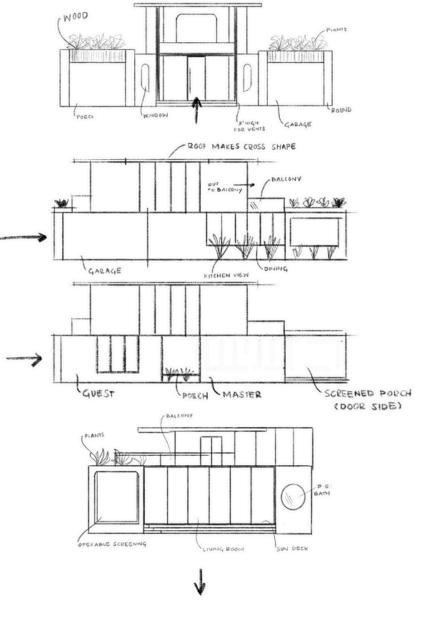

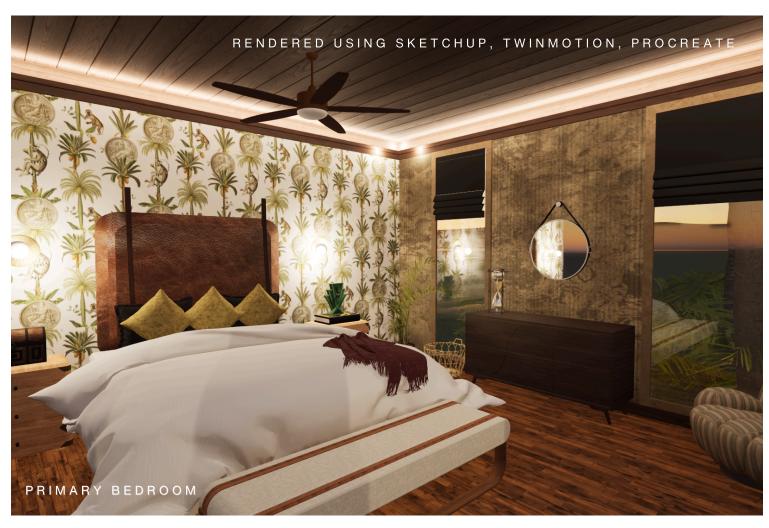
